 - **JOURNAL:** There should be around 35-45 journal entries. There should be some entries related to Pre-Operative Expenses.
 - **LEDGER:** There should be around 25-30 ledger accounts. Ledger Accounts should be closed with Trading A/c and Profit and Loss A/c.

 - Trading, Profit & Loss A/c
 - Balance Sheet
